MARION TREUPEL-FRANCK's specialized in transverse flute with Barthold Kuijken at the Koninklijk Conservatorium in Brussels after her flute studies in Salzburg, Innsbruck and Vienna. Since then she has pursued an active concert career with many renowned baroque orchestras. She is a guest soloist at international concert series for early music. CD recordings have appeared on the Sony Music, Pan Classics, Ramée, Ars Produktion, Mucavi records and Conventus Musicus labels. Marion Treupel-Franck has been considered a successful and passionate teacher for many years. She teaches at the conservatories in Munich and Regensburg and is regularly invited as a lecturer to master classes in Japan, South Africa and Central America, among other places. In 2020, she completed the university certificate course Music Physiology in Everyday Artistic Life at the Berlin Career College.

PENELOPE SPENCERs career as a baroque violinist spans 30 years, during which she has lived and worked in New Zealand, England, the Netherlands and Germany. The prolific violinist has recorded over 45 CDs with the English Baroque Soloists under the direction of Sir Eliot Gardiner. Her own chamber music series, based in London and St. Albans, has been called the hottest classical music ticket in town. In 2008, Penelope Spencer was appointed concertmaster of the New London Consort, where she continued as principal violinist for another 7 years, with 32 international tours in 27 different countries. Since 2017, Penelope has been living in Munich, Germany, where she continues to be artistically active and a passionate lecturer at various baroque courses.
